Guidelines To Submit Abstract

The SEAAIR Conference Proceeding has achieved a significant milestone by being listed in the EBSCO Academic Database, a prestigious online resource that indexes scholarly publications from around the world. This recognition enhances the visibility and credibility of the conference proceedings, making them more accessible to researchers and academics globally.

Guidelines to Submit Abstract

- 1. The maximum length of the abstract is 250 words with at most 5 keywords.
- 2. The following information is needed:
 - a. Title of the article/research
 - b. Sub-theme or track submitted
- 3. The abstract should contain a brief introduction to the research and include the research components as follows:
 - a. Problem statement(s) and research objective(s)
 - b. Research Methodology
 - c. Highlights of the findings
- 4. A key decision to accept or reject the abstract will be based on the relevance to Higher or Post-Secondary Education, Institutional Research theme, and subthemes and follows the rigors and requirements of good research papers or articles, all of which are under the jurisdiction of the Chair of the SEAAIR Technical Committee.

Important Note

<u>English</u>; it is recommended that authors ensure clarity, grammar, syntax, and general expressions and, if necessary, pass through a word check for spelling and grammar before submitting the paper to https://conference.seaairweb.info/, the SEAAIR Conference Management System Paper Submission System.
